

Meet Chevy, a 5 year old painted, miniature horse. He stands 10 hands high or 40 inches.

Chevy has joined PARDS latest program addition, Little Pony Motricity. Little Pony Motricity is designed for ages 4 to 7 (maximum 48" tall and 50 lbs.). The program has fun activities that incorporate fundamental skills in early ages of development, while working with assisted learning through our equine partners.

Lessons run in 10 week sessions, once per week for 30 minutes each week. Riders will work with a pony as their equine partner to challenge obstacle courses designed to create self learning and independence through play.

Chevy loves to be a part of little kids learning. Her patience and calming demeanor helps her rider work with her on learning, while using all their gross motor skills.

Chevy comes to PARDS through the generosity of Kathy McNally who a has leased Chevy to us.







YAWNING IN HORSES

Most of us yawn when we are tired. It's the way our bodies inhale a little extra oxygen to fuel our sleepy brain. Horses, however, don't yawn for the same reason. And, yawning is not an appeasement gesture, <u>as in dogs</u>. A University of Guelph study found that yawning may be a way for a horse to release endorphins. Yawning and most horses will do it several times in a row, is a sign that the horse was feeling stressed, and by yawning, is releasing the stress.
