# Rider Spotlight

#### **Kathrine Shields**



Kathrine has been riding at PARDS for just over two years. She is your typical twenty-two year old in many ways; she enjoys spending time with her friends and family, she enjoys going swimming, goes for motorcycle rides with her dad, she plays the piano and most of all she loves riding horses. So what is it that sets Kathrine apart from others her age? She has no vision. That's right, she is able to do all those seemingly normal activities and excels at them while

not being able to see what's in the world around her! Having known Kathrine all her life (in addition to being her riding instructor, I am also her cousin!), I have seen she does not let her vision impairment slow her down. Being



blind since birth, she has developed and used her other senses to make up for it and she has and continues to accomplish some pretty amazing things. Kathrine can tell you the colour of her shirt and other clothing by

being told what colour it is and then remembers the texture and its colour. It may be the texture or an applique, but what a phenomenal memory! She often comes from her room and announces that she dressed herself and asks "how do I look?"

When Kathrine is at PARDS she trusts her equine partner to be her eyes and legs for her but she is still the rider in charge. The arena is set up as a standardized riding ring used in most competitions. There are letters set at every corner and the center of each wall at set distances. Kathrine is able to gauge where she is by feeling the movement as her horse takes each step and then feels and counts how many steps her horse takes to get to each letter. Kathrine has a horse leader and sidewalker in her lesson as a safety precaution. Kathrine independently steers her horse around all four corners of our ring and can accurately stop her horse beside each letter knowing by memory exactly where she is. The horses best suited for Kathrine are ones



with even, consistent strides and a shorter, sturdy wide build to assist with her balance. This gives her a sense of comfort and she is able to trust her partner with every step. In her lessons we give Kathrine many verbal descriptive cues as to her surroundings and give directions spaced out to allow her time to process before needing to execute the movement such as a corner or a halt.

Being Kathrine's instructor and able to share some insight into just what goes into the lessons we provide has been very rewarding. As her

cousin, to watch her *live* with blindness and see her accomplish so much and be willing to take on anything given to her, I am filled with even more pride. It amazes me that Kathrine can recognize the staff and volunteers here by just the sound of our voices. It tells me that the staff and volunteers truly are engaged with Kathrine. Kathrine is always so happy to be here and that attitude is contagious!

Servus offered so much to his many rider partners over the years but, due to the development of an environmental allergy, Servus was re-homed to a Therapeutic Riding program in the Northwest Territories where he is working with a little boy with Autism in both a youth leadership and therapeutic program.

Dara first learned of PARDS when she attended a Dine and Dance in 2005. She volunteered in programs and became so involved with how energized volunteers were and what PARDS stood for and provided the community with that when a Volunteer Coordinator position came available she jumped at the opportunity and was the successful applicant. She has since been at Servus for about a decade

but she has never lost her enthusiasm for everything PARDS. She thinks PARDS Equine Assisted Therapeutic Programs are an integral service in the community and feels that the work we do aligns very well with Servus' commitment to supporting and strengthening communities. "By supporting PARDS we are helping our members in the community that require your programs." Dara is very supportive of the non-profits in our community saying "Servus enjoys being engaged and invested in local not for profits because they weave communities together making them healthy and strong."

What interests Dara most about PARDS is the expanded service offerings to the community. At a recent Donor Appreciation event she learned about PARDS Equicizer Pinocchio, the cart program and PARDS newest program, Little Pony Motricity. She is also fascinated that PARDS is the only full time, year round therapeutic riding center in Alberta and that Grande Prairie is lucky enough to have this service in the community. When asked what she wishes people knew most about PARDS, Dara says, "That anybody can help. You don't have to be able to help financially to help. If you have money great, if you don't you can volunteer your time and you don't need to be a horse person to do that either. If you don't have time you can refer people. The possibilities to help are endless."

## **Our Equine Partners**



### Angel

Angel is a 10 year old Paint mare that was donated to PARDS by a great friend of ours, Petra Shelton. Petra is a CanTRA Certified Instructor that bought Angel for her therapeutic and Equine Assisted learning program in High Prairie. She was working really well in her program, but sadly just didn't fit into the herd.

Angel arrived at the old PARDS in the spring of 2017 and moved with the rest of the herd in early June to the new facility. It took Angel a while to settle in here. Her previous home had a much smaller herd and didn't have as many people working with her. She slowly realized that everyone at PARDS was pretty nice and we knew she showed the potential to be a great asset to our herd.

Every horse that comes to PARDS goes into a trial period before they become a working herd member in the program. This is a minimum of 30 days but ultimately it is when we feel the horse is ready for our riders.

#### What makes a good therapeutic lesson horse?

- Horses accepted into the PARDS program must be in good health and functionally sound at the walk, trot
  and canter. Horse's movement should create a 3 dimensional walk (up/down, back/front, side/side)
  desired for physical therapy (no gaited breeds).
- Horses should have a nice temperament, low flight response, good ground manners and be able to enjoy the attention of many people.
- Horses that are well schooled in either English or Western, experienced in 4H, Pony Club and the competitive riding disciplines are a huge asset.

In Angel's case she even had previous experience as a therapy horse!!

#### Angel's and all the horses trial period includes .....

- Ground handling including grooming which she loved! ..... she actually scared me the first time working with her because she kept turning her butt to me ..... Then Petra stepped up and starting scratching her butt which was all she wanted!! Sorry Angel, not gonna happen here!
- Mounting and dismounting suitability Stairs, Ramp and Lift
- Riding in the arena and outside
- Lesson props because we learn though play!
- Therapeutic supports with Leaders / sidewalkers
- And finally a trail lesson with instructors posed as students!




### **Interesting Horse Facts**

Adult Day Camp is 4 fun filled days of laughing and learning! Campers experience the social, recreational and physical benefits that result from a four-day immersion in PARDS' therapeutic programs. During their day at camp, participants will enjoy activities including riding lessons, cart driving lessons, stable management and crafts.

Campers do not have to be current PARDS therapeutic riders – the camp is open to community members from ages 15 to adult who have been diagnosed with a physical, behavioural, cognitive and/or social disability. Campers must provide their own support aide if required.
